The annual meeting was held at the historical Governor's Hall, St Thomas' Hospital, London. It was well attended with over 60 delegates, including dermatologists, psychiatrists and psychologists. A total of nine case presentations were delivered to the audience on topics ranging from new entities (e.g. atypical trigeminal trophic

syndrome) to patient-focussed technologies (e.g. a habit reversal app). The first prize for case presentations went to Dr Gkini for her thought-provoking presentation on how dermatologists are affected by patients with delusional infestation. Posters for the meeting were equally fascinating, covering interesting cases of paediatric dermatitis artefacta and ethical issues around safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults. First prize was awarded to Dr Patel for her poster presentation of extra-pyramidal symptoms associated with risperidone for delusional infestation, raising awareness of this rare side effect. Our guest speaker was Magali Redding, the founder of Eczema Outreach Support, a patient and carer support network for young people with eczema. The journey of this charitable programme, from inception to delivery, was insightful and we were delighted to see the positive reception from the eczema community. The meeting was, as usual, very interactive with an 'Ask the experts' session, which gave the audience the chance to discuss challenging cases. We were united in our appreciation for the hard work by Dr Susannah Baron, who organised this meeting in the last year of her position as Secretary on the Executive Committee. She will be succeeded by Dr Alia Ahmed. Our next meeting will be at the British Association of Dermatologists Annual Conference in Liverpool, UK (July 2019). We hope to see you there!
